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## 1. ЦЕЛИ И ЗАДАЧИ ОСВОЕНИЯ ДИСЦИПЛИНЫ

**Цели** освоения дисциплины «Иностранный язык»:

Повышение исходного уровня владения иностранным языком, достигнутого на предыдущей ступени образования, и овладение студентами необходимым и достаточным уровнем коммуникативной компетенции для решения социально-коммуникативных задач в различных областях бытовой, культурной, профессиональной и научной деятельности при общении с зарубежными партнерами, а также для дальнейшего самообразования.

Данная цель носит комплексный характер, и ее достижение обеспечивается достижением следующих специальных целей:

*практическая цель* заключается в формировании у студента готовности к межкультурной коммуникации, что предполагает развитие умений опосредованного письменного (чтение, письмо) и непосредственного устного (говорение, аудирование) иноязычного общения;

*образовательная цель* означает расширение кругозора студентов, повышения уровня их общей культуры и образования, а также культуры мышления, общения и речи;

*развивающая цель* предполагает учет личностных потребностей, интересов и индивидуальных психологических особенностей обучаемых, общее интеллектуальное развитие личности студента, развитие способности к социальному взаимодействию, повышение способности к самообразованию, развитие когнитивных и исследовательских умений;

*воспитательная цель* проявляется в готовности специалистов содействовать налаживанию межкультурных и научных связей, относиться с уважением к духовным ценностям других стран и народов.

**Задачи:**

1) формирование у студентов системы знаний об основных явлениях иностранного языка, их функционировании в иноязычной речи в качестве основы для практического применения изучаемого языка в бытовых и профессиональных ситуациях;

2) формирование системы представлений о странах изучаемого языка (география, политическое устройство, культурное наследие, традиции, система образования), воспитание чувства толерантности по отношению к другим культурам;

3) формирование и развитие творческого мышления для решения коммуникативных задач бытового и профессионального характера;

4) повышение мотивации к изучению иностранного языка как средства расширения кругозора и углубления системных знаний по профилю подготовки/специальности, и как средства самостоятельного повышения профессиональной квалификации.

Изучение иностранных языков и способность в дальнейшем использовать их в профессиональной деятельности предполагают наличие у будущих специалистов навыков работы с иноязычной специализированной литературой для самообразования и получения необходимой в профессиональной деятельности

информации, умения ориентироваться в социальном, культурном и академическом контексте других стран, что предусматривает наличие у специалистов навыков повседневного (бытового) общения на иностранном языке. Профессиональные коммуникативные умения важны для участия в конференциях, подготовки презентаций выступлений, различного рода сообщений, написания научных статей, профессионального общения с иностранными коллегами. Способность и готовность говорить на иностранном языке о своей родной культуре и достижениях российских специалистов в области искусства и социальной деятельности способствует эффективной межкультурной коммуникации и формированию толерантного отношения к иным культурам.

Таким образом, **важность изучения дисциплины «Иностранный язык»** для будущих специалистов заключается в формировании способности к активному непосредственному и опосредованному общению в творческой, научной и профессиональной деятельности в поликультурном пространстве.

## **2. МЕСТО ДИСЦИПЛИНЫ В СТРУКТУРЕ ОПОП ВО**

Дисциплина «Иностранный язык» в структуре ОПОП относится к обязательным дисциплинам базовой части Блока 1 (Б1.О.02.).

Реализация междисциплинарных связей в ходе обучения иностранному языку имеет целью подготовку молодых специалистов, начинающих профессиональную деятельность, к профессиональному использованию иностранного языка в различных сферах деятельности. Междисциплинарные связи реализуются в следующем:

- использование иностранного языка как средства получения профессиональной информации из иноязычных источников;
- использование научных и практических профессиональных знаний в качестве ситуативной основы для моделирования профессионального общения на занятиях;
- использование иностранного языка в целях совершенствования общей гуманитарной подготовки будущих специалистов, совершенствования мыслительных процессов, речевой и социокультурной составляющих коммуникативной компетенции.

Каждый предмет в программе обучения вносит свой специфический вклад в общее образование студента. Курс «Иностранный язык» также тесно связан с дисциплиной «Русский язык и культура речи». Обе дисциплины формируют речевые и интеллектуальные умения. В связи с этим основная функция языковых предметов – коммуникативная, хотя эти предметы имеют и образовательно-воспитательные задачи.

Образовательный аспект предполагает приобретение знаний о культуре и истории страны изучаемого языка. Поэтому связь с дисциплиной «Всеобщая история» очевидна. Эти дисциплины направлены на формирование мировоззрения студента в системе всемирной глобализации.

Изучение иностранного языка предполагает постоянное общение студента с

преподавателем и другими студентами. Поэтому знания, полученные при изучении дисциплины «Психология», находят широкое применение на занятиях иностранного языка в процессе межличностного общения.

### **4. СТРУКТУРА И СОДЕРЖАНИЕ ДИСЦИПЛИНЫ**

Курс иностранного языка рассчитан на 1,5 года обучения. Общая трудоемкость дисциплины составляет 7 зачетных единицы для очной и заочной формы обучения.

Общий объем для очной формы обучения составляет 252 часов (116 часов на контактную работу, 91 час на самостоятельную работу, 45 часов на контроль) и для заочной формы обучения – 252 часа (30 часов на контактную работу, 222 часа на самостоятельную работу).

Формы промежуточной аттестации соответствуют учебному плану вуза: зачет по завершении 1-го и 2-го семестров обучения и экзамен по завершении 3-го семестра обучения для очной и заочной формы обучения.

## **5. ОБРАЗОВАТЕЛЬНЫЕ ТЕХНОЛОГИИ**

Обучение иностранным языкам в неязыковом вузе предполагает следующие формы занятий:

- аудиторные групповые занятия под руководством преподавателя,
- обязательная индивидуальная и групповая самостоятельная работа студента по заданию преподавателя, выполняемая во внеаудиторное время, в том числе с использованием технических средств обучения.

К образовательным технологиям, используемым на занятиях по дисциплине «Иностранный язык», относятся:

- 1) информационно-коммуникационные технологии: предъявление аудио-/визуального и аудиовизуального учебного материала с использованием мультимедийного проектора и интерактивной доски;
- 2) технология коммуникативного обучения;
- 3) технология дифференцированного обучения;
- 4) технология модульного обучения;
- 5) проектный метод обучения;
- 6) технология сотрудничества;
- 7) кейсовая технология;
- 8) игровой метод.

### **6.1. Контроль освоения дисциплины**

Контроль освоения дисциплины производится в соответствии с Положением о порядке проведения текущего контроля успеваемости и промежуточной аттестации по образовательным программам высшего образования ФГБОУ ВО «Краснодарский

государственный институт культуры». Программой дисциплины в целях проверки прочности усвоения материала предусматривается проведение различных форм контроля.

**Для очной формы обучения** *текущий контроль* успеваемости студентов по дисциплине «Иностранный язык» производится по балльно-рейтинговой системе в форме 3 лексико-грамматических тестов в семестр, а также презентации и монологические высказывания по изученным темам.

**Для заочной формы обучения** *текущий контроль* успеваемости студентов по дисциплине «Иностранный язык» производится в форме контрольной работы, включающей устную (собеседование по изученным темам) и письменную часть (грамматическое задание, задание на чтение профессионально-ориентированного текста, чтение и письменный перевод художественного текста).

*Промежуточный контроль* по результатам семестра по дисциплине проходит в форме тестирования на зачёте в 1, 2-ом семестрах и экзамене в 3-ем семестре.

Summer has come; their companies have disbanded, and they take their rest in their favorite caravansary, while they besiege the managers for engagements for the coming season.

At this hour of the afternoon the day's work of tramping the rounds of the agents' offices is over. Past you, as you ramble distractedly through the mossy halls, flit audible visions of houris, with veiled, stary eyes, flying tag-ends of things and a swish of silk, bequeathing to the dull hallways an odor of gaiety and a memory of frangipanni.

Serious young comedians, with versatile Adam's apples, gather in doorways and talk of Booth. Far-reaching from somewhere comes the smell of ham and red cabbage, and the crash of dishes on the American plan.

The indeterminate hum of life in the Thalia is enlivened by the discreet popping — at reasonable and salubrious intervals — of beer-bottle corks. Thus punctuated, life in the genial hostel scans easily — the comma being the favorite mark, semicolons frowned upon, and periods barred.

Miss D'Armande's room was a small one. There was room for her rocker between the dresser and the wash-stand if it were placed longitudinally.

On the dresser were its usual accoutrements, plus the ex-leading lady's collected souvenirs of road engagements and photographs of her dearest and best professional friends.

At one of these photographs she looked twice or thrice as she darned, and smiled friendlily.

"I'd like to know where Lee is just this minute," she said, half aloud.

If you had been privileged to view the photograph thus flattered, you would have thought at the first glance that you saw the picture of a many-petalled white flower, blown through the air by a storm. But the floral kingdom was not responsible for that swirl of petalous whiteness.

You saw the filmy, brief skirt of Miss Rosalie Ray as she made a complete heels-over-head turn in her wistaria-entwined swing, far out from the stage, high above the heads of the audience.

You saw the camera's inadequate representation of the graceful, strong kick, with which she, at this exciting moment, sent flying, high and far, the yellow silk garter that each evening spun from her agile limb and descended upon the delighted audience below.

You saw, too, amid the black-clothed, mainly masculine patrons of select vaudeville a hundred hands raised with the hope of staying the flight of the brilliant aerial token. Forty weeks of the best circuits this act had brought Miss Rosalie Ray, for each of two years.

Rosalie settled herself with a skilful wriggle on the top of Miss D'Armande's wardrobe trunk, and leaned her head against the papered wall. From long habit, thus can peripatetic leading ladies and their sisters make themselves as comfort. able as though the deepest armchairs embraced them.

"I'm going to tell you, Lynn," she said, with a strangely sardonic and yet carelessly resigned look on her youthful face. "And then tomorrow I'll strike the old Broadway trail again, and wear some more paint off the chairs in the agents' offices. ### 7.5. Методические указания и материалы по видам занятий

Изучение дисциплины «Иностранный язык» является неотъемлемой составной частью подготовки студентов различного профиля, призванных в соответствии с требованиями Государственного стандарта достичь уровня владения иностранным языком, позволяющего им продолжать обучение и вести профессиональную деятельность в иноязычной среде.

Задачи курса включают развитие языковой, речевой и социокультурной компетенции, т.е. овладение системой иностранного языка в целях бытового, научного и профессионального общения, протекающего в контакте с

представителями иной культуры.

Все это предопределяет использование таких методов преподавания, которые позволяют сочетать системное овладение материалом, характерное для обучения в отрыве от естественной языковой среды, с коммуникативным подходом, подразумевающим использование разных видов условных ситуаций, имитирующих как бытовое, так и профессиональное и научное общение.

В обучении используются современные активные методы, стимулирующие познавательную и творческую деятельность студента.

В настоящее время перед высшей школой поставлены новые цели, достигнуть которые можно лишь путем творческого подхода к сочетанию традиционных и новых методов и форм обучения, которые формировали бы творческих, знающих специалистов, способных самостоятельно решать сложные профессиональные и научные проблемы.

Активное развивающее обучение позволяет формировать творческое мышление студента, готовое к поиску решения проблем, связанных с профессиональной сферой деятельности, а также с саморазвитием личности.

На занятиях используются следующие формы работы: индивидуальная, парная, в мини-группах, групповая. Такие формы работы зарекомендовали себя как наиболее эффективные в плане отработки нового материала, возможности применять усвоенные ранее знания и трансформировать их. На основе данных форм работы осуществляется процесс поиска и получения новых знаний и выработки новых умений.

Действенным способом повышения мотивации и интереса к занятиям по дисциплине «Иностранный язык» является профессионально-ориентированный подход к изучению иностранного языка, который предполагает формирование способности иноязычного общения в конкретных профессиональных, деловых и научных сферах и ситуациях.

Для погружения студентов в контекст профессиональной деятельности преподаватели используют следующие виды деятельности: дискуссии на основе аутентичных профессионально-ориентированных текстов или аудио-/видеоматериалов, коммуникативные ролевые игры, решение профессионально-ориентированных кейсов, подготовка презентаций на различные профессиональные темы.

Отбор учебных материалов и образовательных технологий осуществляется преподавателем с учетом языковой подготовки конкретной группы студентов и их направления подготовки. Важно то, чтобы учебные материалы были аутентичными (допускается адаптация по языковому уровню), современными и визуальными, а использование информационно-коммуникационных технологий способно обеспечить моделирование ситуаций профессиональной коммуникации в рамках аудиторного занятия.

Ведущей задачей, стоящей перед преподавателем иностранного языка, является реализация комплексного подхода к развитию речевых умений: чтение и аудирование разнообразных аутентичных текстов, а также монологическая и диалогическая устная и письменная речь в рамках профессиональной сферы.

Работу над определенной профессионально-ориентированной темой можно представить определенными этапами.

На первом этапе организуется работа с оригинальным печатным текстом, который для студентов представляет не только ценность в профессиональном содержании, но и является источником профессиональной лексики и терминологии. Работа с текстом включает обсуждение содержания, выполнение лексических заданий, обсуждение тем, затронутых в текстах.

Далее работу над темой можно продолжить просмотром аутентичного видеофрагмента с последующим обсуждением.

Продуктивная монологическая речь может развиваться через подготовку презентаций (устная речь) и написание рецензий, аннотаций, эссе (письменная речь) на профессиональные темы. Творческие практико-ориентированные задания позволяют отработать использование тематической лексики, изученных грамматических конструкций и применить свои профессиональные навыки.

Формирование грамматической компетенции является неотъемлемой частью формирования коммуникативной компетенции в целом. Этим объясняется ориентированность на обучение коммуникативной грамматике. Критериями отбора грамматических явлений являются их частотность и функционирование в бытовых и профессионально-значимых ситуациях. Алгоритм формирования коммуникативной грамматической компетенции состоит из четырех этапов: 1) презентация, 2) языковая практика, 3) коммуникативная практика, 4) контроль. Введение изучаемого грамматического материала начинается с его презентации в адекватном контексте. Во время языковой практики внимание обучаемых акцентируется на функции и форме изучаемого грамматического явления, что способствует формированию грамматического навыка. Коммуникативная практика направлена на развитие и совершенствование коммуникативных грамматических навыков и умений. Итогом работы является сформированность грамматических навыков и умений в процессе обучения, уровень которой определяется тестированием во время контрольных мероприятий.

Таким образом, основными принципами отбора учебного материала и заданий являются практико-ориентированность и интеграция с будущей профессиональной сферой студентов, аутентичность, сочетание устных и письменных заданий рецептивного и продуктивного характера, элементы творчества и эдьютейнмента.

Самостоятельная работа по повышению уровня владения иностранным языком чаще всего связана с чтением текстов из учебной, страноведческой, научно-популярной и научной литературы, периодических изданий и справочной литературы. Во время чтения студент может выполнять задания, предложенные преподавателем или выполнять конспектирование информации, необходимой для изучения других дисциплин. Также самостоятельная работа студента по заданию преподавателя, выполняемая во внеаудиторное время, может осуществляться с помощью мультимедийных средств обучения.

***Методические рекомендации преподавателям для работы со студентами с ограниченными возможностями здоровья по изучению дисциплины «Иностранный язык».***

Преподаватели должны быть ознакомлены с психофизическими особенностями обучающихся с ограниченными возможностями здоровья и учитывать их при организации образовательного процесса. Преподаватель выстраивает индивидуальную траекторию обучения с помощью здоровьесберегательных технологий.

При организации образовательного процесса со слабослышащей аудиторией необходима особая фиксация на артикуляции выступающего – следует говорить громче и четче. Для лучшего усвоения материала необходимо либо записывать ключевые моменты, либо использовать презентации на интерактивной доске. В процессе обучения студентов с нарушениями слуха иностранному языку в рамках инклюзивного образования стоит учитывать, что чтение и письмо являются для слабослышащих студентов не только навыками владения языком, но и основными, важными средствами обучения и контроля уровня усвоения знаний. Поэтому учебный курс должен включать в себя достаточное количество текстового материала и письменных упражнений, содержать правила с примерами в письменной форме.

Для усвоения информации слабовидящим требуется большее количество повторений и тренировок. Слабовидящим следует разрешить использовать звукозаписывающие устройства и компьютеры, как способ конспектирования, во время занятий. Информацию необходимо представлять исходя из специфики слабовидящего студента: крупный шрифт, аудиофайлы. Всё записанное на доске должно быть озвучено.

При общении с людьми, испытывающими затруднения в речи, не следует подчеркнуто перебивать и поправлять их. Необходимо быть готовым к тому, что разговор с человеком с затрудненной речью займет больше времени.

Преподаватель должен проявлять педагогический такт, создавать ситуации успеха для студентов с ОВЗ, своевременно оказывать им помощь, развивать веру в собственные силы и возможности.

Электронно-библиотечная система обеспечивает возможность индивидуального доступа для каждого обучающегося из любой точки, в которой имеется доступ к сети Интернет.

Оперативный обмен информацией с отечественными и зарубежными вузами и организациями осуществляется с соблюдением требований законодательства Российской Федерации об интеллектуальной собственности и международных договоров Российской Федерации в области интеллектуальной собственности. Для обучающихся обеспечен доступ к современным профессиональным базам данных, информационным справочным и поисковым системам.

Все компьютерные классы подключены к локальной сети вуза и имеют выход в Интернет, в наличии стационарное мультимедийное оборудование (проекторы, экраны, интерактивные доски), возможно проведение занятий на базе музея вуза (тачпанель, экран, проектор).

Учебные аудитории для проведения практических занятий оснащены столом преподавателя, стулом преподавателя, столами для обучающихся, стульями для обучающихся, компьютерами/ моноблоками, интерактивными досками.
